Foreword

The 1878-S Liberty Seated Half Dollar is one of those classic rarities of the U.S. coin series that always demands attention and respect, and for good reasons. Collecting Liberty Seated half dollars is popular and the 1878-S is the key to the date/mint set. With an extremely low mintage of 12,000, I estimate that not more than 60 examples exist today. Detailed in this booklet are 51 different examples that I have been able to identify with leeway granted for a few that are hidden away and off the market for years.

Owning an 1878-S half dollar in any condition entitles you to informal membership of a very select group of elite collectors. Few collectors have or now own an 1878-S half dollar and, by owning one, you set yourself apart from many others. Simply put, few are available, and they are expensive, often outside the financial resources of most collectors. Even some of the famous coin collections lacked an 1878-S or had a low grade or problem coin. For example, Eric P. Newman did not have one, Anderson-Dupont had a damaged coin, and it was missing from the Garrett Collection. All 1878-S half dollar owners I know are immensely proud to admit they own one.

Randy Wiley and I both have been tallying and researching this date for many decades. It took a lot of time and diligence to record on and off market exchanges of these coins. We spoke with many collectors and dealers and reviewed many price lists and auction catalogues in search of information on 1878-S half dollars. Due to the 1878-S half dollar's value, one most often appears at a public auction. Unfortunately, most auction catalogues older than the 1960s lack sufficient images and lot descriptions to positively identify a specific 1878-S. Consequently, most accurate information on 1878-S half dollars can be found from the past 50-60 years. Luckily, the top modern auction companies maintain detailed online records, easily accessible, and with great images of the offered coins.

I was fortunate to have many what I called "spies" helping me; these were collectors of the series that reported sightings of 1878-S half dollars. Chief among those was LSCC member Bob Hamby who scouted the southern shows. He would often call me from a coin show bourse floor with details and then send me images. Dennis Fortier and John Frost were also key to helping me. To them and others, I am grateful. Many thanks to John Frost and Dennis Fortier for their review of this manuscript – their comments added greatly to the clarity and content.

I hope you find the information contained herein useful. It represents many, many hours of fun researching this date.


<u>Purpose of this publication</u>. With this document, it is my desire and ultimate goal to record information (images, known pedigree, and miscellaneous notes) on all the 1878-S half dollars. I believe there exists approximately 60 examples (51 are detailed here) and finding them all with useful pedigree information and images will be a worthwhile continual task with constant updates. This is my start (although I have been keeping records for decades) at that effort.

I have assigned a BB-## to each coin so that past and future presences of these coins may be easily tracked. Cross references to Randy Wiley's draft attribution numbers are also contained herein as RW-##.

<u>Disclaimer</u>. This *Register* is only as good as the information collected from many sources. For example, my 1878-S BB-11, from the Stack's sale of the Buddy Byers collection, was described with a pedigree from the James T. Clarke New Netherlands Sale #47, April 1956, lot 1342. That information is not accurate; the New Netherlands coin is actually the "Stellar" half dollar. I have taken great pains to remove similar inaccuracies, but I suspect some information included here may not be accurate and/or incomplete.

Conversely, there are many obvious "holes" in the pedigrees listed herein. For example, 1878-S BB-30 was listed by Julian Liedman in 1994 but not seen again until 2006. That does not mean that Julian had the coin in his possession this entire time. It merely indicates the known ownership or public appearance of that coin.

<u>1878-S half dollars by grade</u>. The chart below depicts the census of examples known to me by major grade.



From the chart depicted above, it is readily apparent that about a quarter (24%) of the known coins are in "Details" grade while another quarter (25%) are Mint State. Others are spread across the grades with a heavy concentration in VG. The "Details" graded coins range from Fair to AU.

<u>How did I collect this data?</u> I acknowledge that much information is missing from this *Register* and there may be some inaccurate data. I strived to have only accurate information. I researched this date using many sources. They are listed below:

- Person to person conversations. In most cases, I recorded the information I received; some was considered questionable until I was able to verify it or discard it.
- My personal numismatic library of auction catalogues going back to the 1930s. *Numismatic News' Auction Prices Realized for U.S. Coins* for individual years was a reference time saver. Older catalogues and many catalogues missing from individual libraries are now available on the Newman Numismatic Portal. This portal made many numismatic bibliophiles' libraries outmoded, but it is a great time saver.
- Online auction company archives. These reference libraries of auction results usually had great images, slab numbers, and good descriptions and notably include Heritage and Stack's Bowers.
- Numismatic and dealer publications. These include but are not limited to *The Gobrecht Journal, Coin World, Numismatic News*, and dealer price lists and announcements.
- Coin show bourse and dealer cases. Roaming the large coin shows sometimes produced an 1878-S half dollar in a dealer's case. Mostly, dealers were cooperative with allowing me to image or draw the details of the coin and record information. In all cases, past pedigree information was not offered.
- Third party grading companies' online records. I have more on this in the following sections, but these provided great information and leads for me to follow.
- My "Spies." I mentioned this in my Foreword, but it is worth repeating. Many numismatic friends knew of my effort to document all 1878-S half dollars are were proactive in helping me with information. These Spies would find them on bourse floors, online, and in publications are were helpful in my effort to complete this *Register*. Some of these Spies were Randy Wiley, Julian Leidman, Brian Greer, Bob Hamby, Dennis Fortier, John Frost, Rich Uhrich, Dick Osburn, Brian Cushing, Len Augsburger, David Lange, Gene Gardner, Harry Smith, Ed Zimmerman, and other unnamed collectors and dealers.
- Julian Leidman. I want to specifically mention Julian for his assistance. Julian prides himself in attending every major numismatic auction. In his copy of the auction catalogues, he recorded his personal notes including condition and comments of numerous coins including 1878-S half dollars. Early on, Julian made his auction catalogue library available to Randy and me. Randy spent many hours photocopying catalogue pages with 1878-S half dollars. These were a great help in researching specific coins and, in some cases, determining condition census.
- Randy Wiley. Randy and I researched this date together for many years. He and I often compared notes and worked to eliminate duplicates and understand pedigrees. This *Register* would not have happened without his efforts.

<u>Credit to Randy Wiley</u>. Randy Wiley and I have both been tracking information of 1878-S half dollars for decades. His research played a pivotal role in completion of this document. I wish to acknowledge his expertise, diligence, hard work, patience, and expert record keeping practices in tracking these rarities.

<u>Rumored 1878-S half dollar hoard</u>. I have information from multiple reliable sources that a West Coast (SF Bay area?) collector was hoarding 1878-S half dollars in the early to mid-1990s. Most of the details on this hoard is confidential (and unknown to me) but supposedly the collector accumulated a half roll (10 coins) before liquidating them privately over time.

Photographs. Most of the images of 1878-S half dollars depicted in this Register are from other sources. While some are not ideal for a modern state of the art publication, many are the best that I have or can get but are good enough to properly identify a specific coin.

<u>Confidentiality</u>. Much information provided to me in confidence (such as current owners) is omitted to protect individual privacy. That information, however, is included in my personal unpublished reference copy.

^c Note: PCGS and NGC do not list separate "Details" grade coins but include them in the total number graded. ANACS does separate "Details" graded coins by grade.

¹ The total number of coins in the encapsulation statistics table (58+) does not directly correspond to the total number of coins in this book (51). I have not seen all of the encapsulated coins, there are likely some crack-outs and submissions in these totals, and at least four coins are still in the services' database but certified elsewhere (see Census on the next page).








