An 18th & 19th Century Tavern Life Theme ...PK

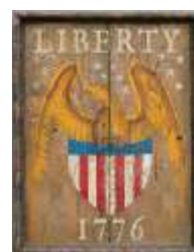
You have probably noticed a few hints recently in E-Gobrecht related to past Taverns across America.
