 This die appears very similar to Obverse 6 which was used on WB-9. This die lacks the clash marks and the die cracks between stars 1-6 are slightly different. Specifically, this die crack between stars 4-5 connects the inner star points while on Obverse 6, the outer two points are connected.

• Medium CC with close spacing with CCs slanting up and 2nd C close to stem (photo).



• Curved die line on the scroll at the upper serif of the (TRU)S(T) (photo)



• The rust lumps seen on the previous use of this die (WB-9) are now very weak. The heavy die clashes are polished away as are much of the rust lumps. Shown above is the weak lump between (HAL)F D(OL) (photo).

This is the only use of this obverse die and second use of this reverse die.
