It has its newly designed cover by Jim Macor that we as members all look forward to seeing at the beginning of each year.


## Benjamin Franklin





### LSCC returns to ANA Summer Seminar!

After a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic, the ANA Summer Seminar is back and the LSCC is presenting two classes at this premier event, one during each session. Summer Seminar is held adjacent to ANA Headquarters at Colorado College in Colorado Springs.

<u>Session 1 is June 18-23 and Session 2 is June 25-30</u>. Both classes have limits on the number of students, so reserve early. The course catalog and registration information may be found at the ANA website, **www.money.org/summer-seminar**.

### Session 1 - June 18-23 - Course #9

# Developing a Passion for Liberty Seated Coinage (back by popular demand!)

This course features interactive discussions on many topics, including the history and development of Liberty Seated coinage, evolution of the designs, and grading, including the nuances between series.

The core of the class features a deep dive into each of the seven series: half dimes, dimes, twenty-cent pieces, quarters, halves, and both Liberty Seated and Trade dollars.

These deep dives entail *hand's on inspection* of many coins in all grades in all series, and will include in-depth discussions into collecting strategies, key dates, major varieties, and variety attribution. Historical perspectives on various topics will be offered throughout the course. Students will have access to both reference materials and sit-down guidance from instructors throughout the course.

**Instructors:** John Frost (LSCC Education Director), Len Augsburger (LSCC President) and Craig Eberhart (Auction column, noted New Orleans coinage expert).

### **Session 2 - June 25-30 - Course #32**

### The Legacy and Coinage of Father-Son Mint Engravers William and Charles Barber

This course will explore the history and coinage designed by 5th and 6th Chief Mint Engravers, William Barber (1869-1879) and Charles Barber (1880-1917). This hands-on class will study in detail all 6 circulation coin series bridging from the late 19th into the early 20th century. This includes William Barber's Trade dollars and twenty-cent pieces, along with Charles Barber's Liberty nickels, Barber dimes, quarters and half dollars.

Deep dives entail *hand's on inspection* of many coins in all grades in all series, and will include in-depth discussions into collecting strategies, key dates and major varieties.

In addition, we will explore the patterns and mint medals created by these prolific engravers, along with their designs of commemoratives and coins of other countries that were made under contract with the U.S. Mint.

**Instructors:** John Frost, LSCC Education Director and Barber Coin Collectors' Society President, and Glenn Holsonbake, Americana Rare Coin.

# <u>Press Release</u>: 100% of Profits from Sale of Zelensky Medals will be Contributed to Help Ukrainians in Their Homeland and as Refugees





The non-profit Jewish-American Hall of Fame has commissioned Jim Licaretz, a former sculptor-engraver at the U.S. Mint, to create a bold heroic portrait of Ukraine's valiant President Volodymyr Zelensky for a limited edition of large 3½ inch art medals — which are being offered to the public, with 100% of the profits being contributed to aid the embattled Ukrainians in their homeland and as refugees.

The reverse of the medals feature Zelensky's inspirational words "Our truth is that this is our land," and the state seal of Ukraine. The quote is an excerpt from a speech, in which Zelensky said: "We are not putting down arms. We will be defending our country, because our weapon is truth, and our truth is that this is our land, our country, our children, and we will defend all of this."

Licaretz created the original model in resin using a 3-D printer. He then made a mold and will cast medals in bonded bronze, each of which Licaretz will hand finished.

<u>Volodymyr Oleksandrovych Zelensky</u> was born to Jewish parents on January 27, 1978 in Kryvyi Rih, then in the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic. Zelensky's great-grandfather and his three great-granduncles died in the Holocaust.

Zelensky earned a degree in law from the Kyiv National Economic University. He then pursued comedy and created a company which produced films, cartoons, and TV shows including the TV series Servant of the People, in which Zelensky played the role of the Ukrainian president. In 2019, Zelensky actually won the Ukrainian Presidential election with over 73 per cent of the votes.

No more than 199 Zelensky commemorative medals will be issued, each accompanied by a certificate of authenticity and a stand so that it can be proudly exhibited in a home or office. The cost is \$150 plus \$15 per order for shipping, with a limit of 3 medals per person. If all medals are sold, a contribution of about \$15,000 will be made to help the Ukrainian victims of Russian aggression. # In Washington's Footsteps

In conjunction with the recent Baltimore coin show, capably hosted by Whitman from March 31 to April 2, a few of us visited Paul Kluth's latest venture, the Ambassadors general store and private residence club in Taneytown, MD. The drive from downtown Baltimore toward Taneytown is full of suburban strip malls, tract developments, and the like, but Taneytown is an older community with a more colorful, vintage downtown area. Ambassadors is situated at 6-8 Frederick St. on the site of the old Adam Good Tavern. A bronze plaque greets visitors with the fact that President Washington visited the Tavern in 1791 while traveling north to Philadelphia (where the federal government was seated prior to moving to Washington, D.C.).







Legend has is that Washington interpreted the name as "a dam good tavern". Whether true or not, it's a good story, even if the tavern was not "damn good". In any case, Paul will be challenged to live up to Washington's supposed assessment of "damn good". The Adam Good Tavern was demolished long ago, and in the late 18th century a prominent citizen (Norman Hagan) erected a stately residence on the site, with a storefront, to the right, incorporated into the structure. Hagan operated the retail space as a general store. The foundation, visible in the cellar, retains some of the original stonework from Washington's time.

The property today is massive, with an addition added behind the storefront in the 1950s, to accommodate a bowling alley. Graffiti from the pinsetters remains evident on the back wall of the addition, which today serves as workshop space. Paul notes the total size of the complex is 7,500 square feet, while my eyeball estimate was a bit higher. In any case, he has plenty of space to build the business.

The storefront previously operated as an antique store, until 2008, and has been vacant since. The store inventory was left behind, and Paul has been busily organizing the contents for a relaunch this month. He intends to initially open the store on the weekends. The residence portion of the property will be offered for non-profit use, group events, gallery space, and other purposes.

Paul hosted lunch for the three of us (Bill Bugert and Dennis Fortier were also in attendance) and a good time was had by all. I'm looking forward to seeing what Paul continues to do with the space and build the business. Check it out on your next trip to the Baltimore show, or if you are simply passing through the area.



# Missing the Boat

### "Gobrecht" Bust Half Dollars #3 by Jim Koenings, LSCC #2798 & JRCS #048

I "Missed the Boat" in 1988 when I had the opportunity to buy Jules Reiver's "Variety Identification Manual (VIM) for United States Reeded Edge Half Dollars, 1836-1839" for only \$10. In November 2009, I purchased a slightly used Jules' VIM on eBay for \$25 and decided to try collecting them. With the help of Dick Graham, who wrote the most important book ever written on the subject "A Registry of Die Varieties of Reeded Edge Half Dollars, 1836-1839". Today, I am the leading collector of "Gobrecht" halves. Jules Reiver passed in 2002 and Dick Graham sold most of his collection in July 2021, so I am the only person left to provide you with information on the series other than Dick Graham.

By November 2017, I had 53 of the 56 known die marriages. The remaining 3 were basically non-collectable; 1838-O (9 known), 1839-O GR-2 (1 known) and 1839 GR-3 (1 known). But that was when the real FUN began. I started looking into Die States and Rotated Dies with almost no competition. At this time, I know of only one or two collectors that may be studying die stages or die states.

In March, I turned 80 years old and have been sending monthly Newsletters on the "38 Most Common Reeded Edge Die Marriages" since August 2019. I currently have over 100 collectors that receive these Newsletters, but only 16 of them are LSCC members, so far...

I believe LSCC members are far better equipped to study "Gobrecht" halves as they use microscopes and investigate minute details whereas John Reich Collectors Society members are forced to look at hand stamped dies that were made before Christian Gobrecht.

In a recent telephone conversation with Dick Graham, he said that he no longer collects Reeded Edge Halves and has no intention of printing any additional copies. He helped David Kahn at the recent Baltimore Coin Show and autographed the last 10 of 100 reprints of his book. He now intends to spend more time with his wife and play more rounds of golf.

### 1837 GR-5, Late Die State

The above die marriage, with the circular die break, is very common. I found 6 specimens listed on eBay last month. I am sure you can find a specimen that fits your budget. If all 6 were sold, be patient another specimen will show up shortly. The reason I chose this die marriage is because the same obverse is used on 3 other 1837 die marriages. This die marriage comes with and without die breaks and it also comes with a rotated reverse and as not rotated.
