



The background image comes from subscriber John Bianco while vacationing in South Carolina looking over a lake on a dark moonlit night.







The Auction Realm by Craig Eberhart, LSCC #1348

Sale of the 'Pioneer Boone Family Collection' of Liberty Seated Half Dollars

Another extensive collection of Liberty Seated half dollars was sold this past month. It was assembled by James Bailey, a longtime LSCC member and a descendent of Daniel Boone. His "Pioneer Boone Family Collection" was sold by Heritage Auctions on May 16th and included about 340 Liberty Seated half dollars. Some of the more interesting and/or rare issues are listed in the following table.

* This collection included the finest example of the four known 1842 small date, small letter reverse half dollars. An uncirculated 1878-S, the rarest collectible Liberty Seated half dollar date was also part of this sale.

Deluxe Edition of the Ahwash Reference

In the March 2005 E-Gobrecht, John McCloskey discussed Kam Ahwash's *Encyclopedia of United States Liberty Seated Dimes* (1977). Ahwash's book was groundbreaking in the field of Liberty Seated variety collecting – for the first time, the quality of the photography (by Roger Burdette, who is still active) was sufficient for the attribution of most issues. Ahwash presented McCloskey with a copy of the book, and I will let John pick up the story from there:

In recognition of my contributions to his research, Kam gave me a copy of the Premiere Edition of his encyclopedia when it was published in 1977. This book has a padded blue cover that is stamped with the title Encyclopedia of United States / Liberty Seated Dimes / 1837 – 1891 in bold silver lettering. The author's name "Kamal M. Ahwash / 1977" is printed below the title. In the lower right corner of the cover, my name "John W. McCloskey/ LSCC 89" is stamped in the same silver lettering. The books in this edition are numbered in the lower right corner of the first page [title page] in the text. My book is designated as "No 002."

I presume that book "No 001" was Kam's personal copy of the encyclopedia. Does anybody know who owns that book today? Does anybody know how many numbered copies were printed in the Premiere Edition of the encyclopedia? Did you buy a copy of the Premiere Edition when it was published in 1977? If so, what is its number? Did you buy a copy of the Premiere Edition second hand from another collector or dealer? If so, who was the copy initially registered to and what is its number?

As it turns out, there are two copies that come before the McCloskey copy. The most significant of these is Ahwash's personal copy. Remarkably, this volume showed up soon after John's query was published, in the George Kolbe sale of June 4, 2005, lot 62. This copy is bound in leather and identified by Ahwash's name, stamped in silver and placed in the bottom right corner of the front cover. This book sold strongly, for \$4,830. The Ahwash copy, however, does not have the "No 001" designation on the title page. While it is certain this is the Ahwash copy, the mystery remains – where is the copy with "No 001?"

We can now answer this question – Ahwash presented copy "001" to Walter Breen. As with the McCloskey and Ahwash copies, Breen's name is stamped in silver in the lower right corner of the front cover. The Breen copy bears the "No 001" stamp on the title page. Included in the book is a transmittal letter from Ahwash to Breen, dated June 14, 1977:

"Dear Walter:


Love and peace, Kam

Breen responded with a detailed, four-page list of recommended edits. Despite all the corrections, he noted "Thanks for the chance to see your labor of love. A magnificent effort, an excellent specimen of bookmaking!" With this new information, we can now list the early copies:

"000" [unnumbered] Kam Ahwash, leatherbound 001 Walter Breen, bound in padded blue cloth 002 John McCloskey, bound in padded blue cloth

Ahwash produced one hundred of these numbered copies (all dated 1977), and I invite any readers who own a numbered copy to contact me.

1839 'Gobrecht' Bust Half Dollars

'Gobrecht' Bust Half Dollars #5 by Jim Koenings, LSCC #2798 & JRCS #048

The year 1839 Reeded Edge Half Dollar has a reported mintage of 1,392,976 that is distributed between 8 known die marriages having 4 different obverses and 7 different reverses. Three of the die marriages are very rare and 5 are common, rated R-1 (over 1,000 known) to R-3 (201 to 500 known).

The example on the previous page is very easy to attribute as it is the only 1839 reverse that is missing dentils from 12 o'clock to 2 o'clock.

During the last week in May 2022, I did a survey of 1839 Reeded Edge Halves on eBay and found the following:

The above chart looks normal except for 2 things, 1839 GR-8 is too few for its R-3 rating and 1839-O GR-5 has too many for its R-4+ rating.

Mintage Reported:

I think the mintage for 1839-O is closer to 178,976. A 1966 Red Book showed 162,976.
