
Editor's View From the Rim








The Curious Collector by Len Augsburger, LSCC #1271

Half Dollar Die Usage, 1839-1852

This month we compare the reported Guide Book mintages for half dollars, 1839-1852, and compare them against the die usage as reported in the Bugert encyclopedia. As they say, a picture is worth a thousand words, so let's jump in:




A few observations:

• For almost all issues, the reverse die count for each date & mintmark exceeds the obverse die count. This is as expected – the reverse, or "tail" die, was typically on the bottom of the coining chamber and received the force of the blow from the "head" die, exerting on the order of 50 tons of pressure. Reverse dies wore more quickly. The Mint considered the obverse of the coin more important than the reverse, hence the desire to wear the obverse dies more slowly.

- New Orleans wore their dies harder than Philadelphia. Over the period 1839-1852, Philadelphia produced 162k coins per obverse die and 134k coins per reverse die (17% lower), while New Orleans came in at 190k and 155k (18% lower), respectively. No surprise here to Liberty Seated collectors, who have noted a strong variance in the production quality of coins struck at New Orleans in this period. [Editor's Note: If you do the math, a mere 1% difference represents a very large number of strikes or struck coins.]
- In general, die life is around 160k coins per die, with variations as noted for obverse vs. reverse usage, and the Mint of origin.
- The "coins per die" ratio falls significantly in low mintage years. Dies were likely produced in advance of having a complete understanding of what the coining demands would be for the upcoming year. If the Philadelphia Mint had four obverse dies for 1851 half dollars, there was no sense not using all of them, even if an old die had more "life" in it.
- The biggest outlier in the group is of course the 1843 Philadelphia issue, for which 18 obverse dies and 29 reverse dies were used. The reverse dies of this year are notoriously cracked, and clearly something changed in this year with respect to either the die preparation or press settings. While the effect is most notable in 1843, Bugert notes cracked dies among 1842 and 1844 emissions as well. By contrast, the New Orleans Mint, which also had a large production in this year, used only 10 obverse and 8 reverse dies. For once, the New Orleans Mint personnel could point the finger in the other direction! While it seems there should be something in the Mint correspondence regarding this problem, I am not aware of any such discussion.


