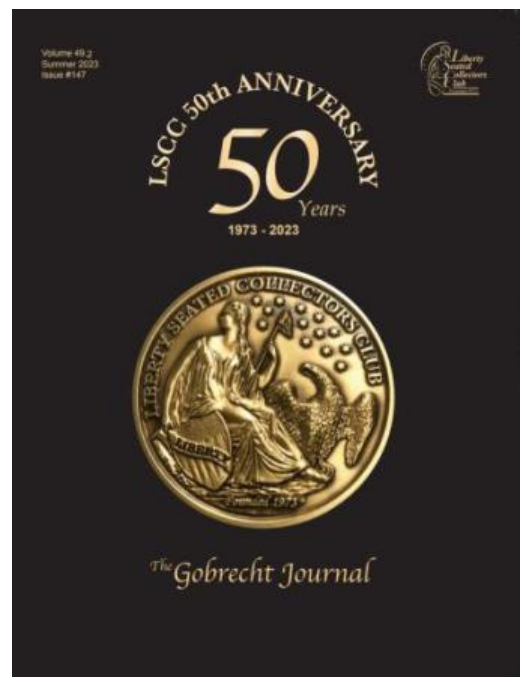


President's Message

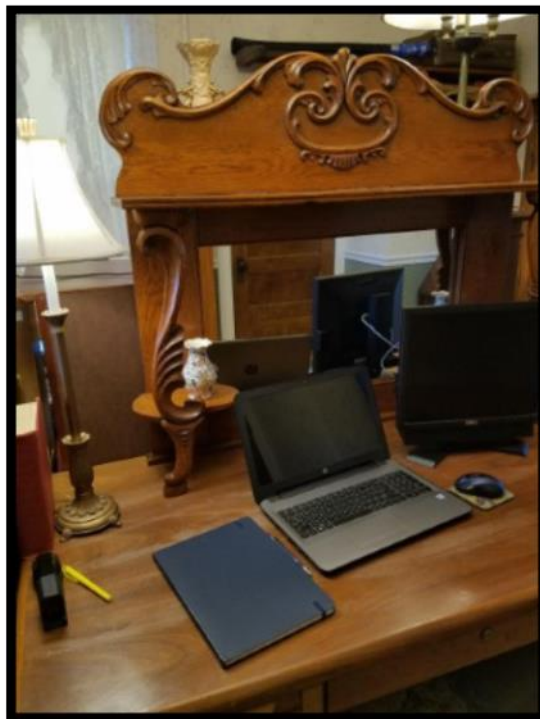

Commentary on the State of the Coin Market and Liberty Seated Coins (as of FUN January 2024) by LSCC Members

[*Len Augsburg*] I was not at the FUN show, but the market is clearly strong. Heritage Auctions just reported their 2023 results and noted enthusiastic bidder interest across all categories of collectibles. Within the Liberty Seated arena, bifurcation remains in full force with the best pieces selling at levels substantially above published guide values. Gold is close to record high levels, which generally correlates with increased market activity in the rare coin space. For 2024, let's note that the stock market tends to move up during election years, meaning that there will be cash available to fuel the collectibles space. For those thinking about selling, this year should deliver healthy results.

On the buy side, I'd urge collectors to be contrarians – for example, instead of paying the CAC premium for a CAC or CACG coin, think about coins that are clearly original but not stickered for what-ever reason – perhaps they are liners, or perhaps the reason for CAC not liking the coin is completely unclear. They are many such attractive pieces in the market. I submitted one such coin to CAC that I am sure will sell for multiples of the guide price when the time comes. The piece was in an MS61 holder and John Albanese thought he detected the slightest bit of rub at the high points. No sticker! Regardless, the coin exhibits exceptional eye appeal and would be a bargain if offered at the PCGS guide level.

[*Clint Cummins*] **Liberty Seated Half Dime - Attribution Guide.** Overview: A work-in-progress, an attribution guide modelled after guides already created by LSCC members. A compilation of research already done (much by Steve Crain and Clint Cummins and a group of dedicated half dime enthusiasts).

Update: In recent months, life's little challenges has slowed the project for attribution of "Liberty Seated Half Dimes". Last fall, the upgrade of several existing guides to a newer format was completed.

Currently the 1871's are still in the old format, but are nearly updated. After that, I expect to work on one or two a month. The 1870-s is now ready to view.

A few common dates will obviously be difficult (1853, 1854, 1856, 1857, 1858), but much ground work has already been done. If the past is a guide, the O mints will be finished first, and the difficult ones above will follow. The current Guide is available at the following link:

More on the Stack's Bowers Liberty Seated Dollar Sale

Last month we wrote about a group of 13 1860-O dollars that appeared in the Stack's Bowers Collectors Choice auction of December 5. One of the buyers at the sale phoned me with further comments. He examined the Seated dollars in the sale firsthand and felt the group had been together for an extended period time, as many of the pieces shared a common "look." Pieces were not freshly scrubbed to a white color, and secondary toning, if any, appeared to be vintage. This buyer was pleased with his purchases, about 20 coins total, and felt that the prices paid were quite reasonable.

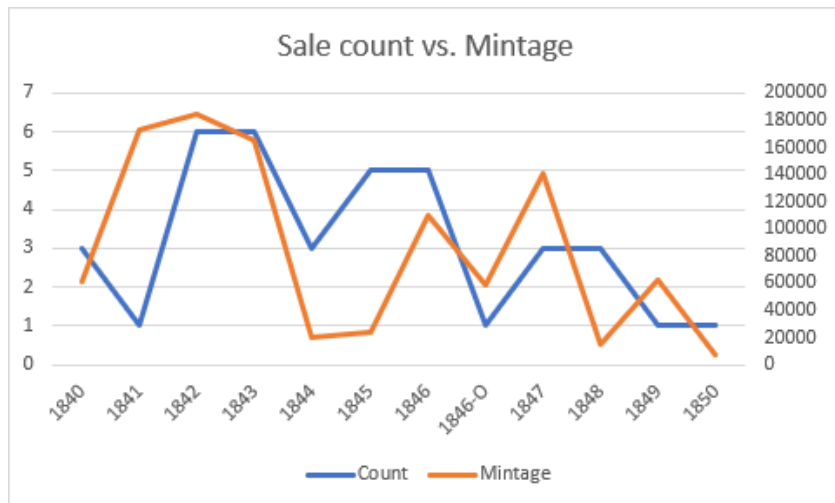
Dates represented by the Liberty Seated dollars in this sale broke down as follows:

1840 - 3	1846 - 5	1860-O - 13
1841 - 1	1846-O - 1	1863 - 1
1842 - 6	1847 - 3	1868 - 1
1843 - 6	1848 - 3	1870 - 2
1844 - 3	1849 - 1	1872 - 3
1845 - 5	1850 - 1	1873 - 1

A few common dates are suspiciously absent, such as the 1859-O, 1871, and 1872. One can only hope a subsequent sale will reveal these pieces. Issues in the 1850s and the 1870s Carson City pieces are scarce, and their lack of representation is not a surprise. If these coins existed in the group, they would no doubt have been placed in higher profile auctions.

The chart on this page compares the number of pieces for the 1840s coins in the sale vs. the mintage for each date. The correlation is not the strongest, but is close enough to speculate that these pieces might have been randomly drawn from circulation long ago.

The grade distribution of the 59 Seated dollars in the sale was typical, ranging from VF30 to AU58.

In general, Seated dollars circulated little, since after the 1853 Coinage Act the weight in the dollar exceeded (slightly) that of two half dollars. Extremely worn pieces are thus infrequently encountered. This pattern is similar to gold coinage of the same era. Clearly, the lower denominations were the workhorses of the economy, not surprising in an era when a dollar a day represented a working wage in many parts of the country.

Attention LSCC Half Dollar Collectors
2024 Census for Capped Bust Reeded Edge Halves

“Gobrecht” Bust Half Dollars
by Jim Koenings, LSCC #2798 & JRCS #048

Last November, I began asking all my Newsletter publication readers to begin reporting their inventories of Reeded Edge Halves for the 3rd Census. This included 27 LSCC members and about 100 additional collectors that had signed up for my free publication. **The deadline for sending your updated inventories is March 15, 2024** with the results being printed in the June-July issues of both the JRCS Journal and the equivalent E-Gobrecht or The Gobrecht Journal.

This 2024 Census is very important as it will determine new rarity ratings for all 56 known die marriages. There were several die marriages where rarity ratings changed in the 2nd Census of 2021. The 2024 Census may reflect changes from newly collected data.

This notice is mainly for E-Gobrecht subscribers who are not receiving my Newsletters. If you have Reeded Edge Halves, please let me know by sending me your email address. I will then send you a form that you can fill out. If you do not know the die marriage, you can send photos to me and I will help you attribute them. Please send your emails to Jim Koenings at:

Again, please report every die marriage you can as each coin is important!

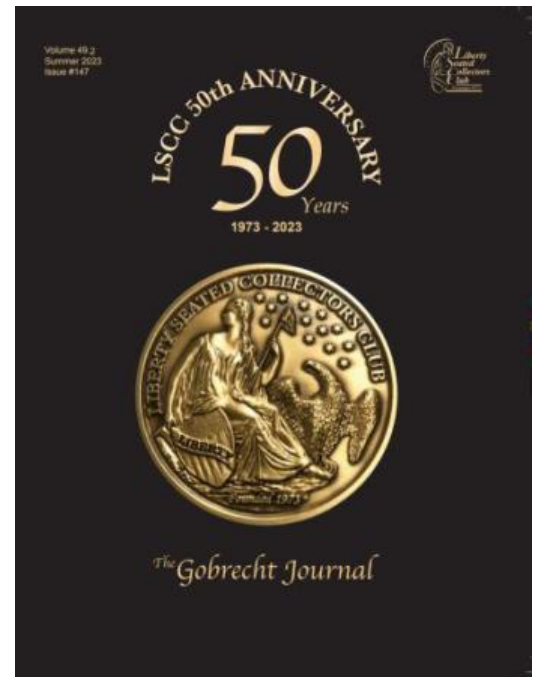
