





The Curious Collector by Len Augsburger, LSCC #1271

A Bit of Medallic Serendipity

A few years ago, I acquired an example of the Franklin Institute medal, which bears a bust of the American statesman and inventor Benjamin Franklin. Christian Gobrecht engraved the dies for this medal in 1825, based on a portrait by Thomas Sully. Sully was later involved with the initial designs for the obverse of the Liberty Seated coinage. Philadelphia was a small city at the time, and the artists no doubt all knew each other and were familiar with the work of their colleagues.





The Franklin Institute, in Philadelphia, used these medals to recognize achievement in science and industry. This example was awarded to H. Troemner, "for Fine Balances" in 1874. Until recently, I did not even think to look up Mr. Troemner. I was pleased when I did. It turns out Troemner was a vendor to the U.S. Mint. A January 29, 1890 letter from the Mint Director Edward Leach to the Philadelphia Mint Superintendent O.C. Bosbyshell directs the purchase of two Troemner scales at a total cost of \$2,200. Precise accounting of the gold and silver flowing to the Mint was critical to ensuring integrity in the country's money supply, and scales played an important role by weighing precious metal deposits, in addition to finished coins. That the Mint placed such confidence in Troemner says much.

In compliance with your request of the 27th instant you are authorized to purchase from Henry Troemner for the use of the Coiner's department of you mint one six-foot standard balance and one improved four-foot balance, both balances to be made of the best material and with all the latest improvements, at a net cost of \$2,200. Mr. Troemner will render his bill for the net amount as stated.

You are also authorized to purchase from Mr. Troemner a special coin balance, 36-inch beam, for the use of the Cashier, the bill for the same to be made out for the net amount as indicated above.

The old balances you will deliver to Mr. Troemner when the new ones are furnished and put in place by him.

This example is not Troemner's only Franklin Institute award. A search of the Heritage Auctions archives reveals two other examples, a silver medal awarded in 1885 for "analytical balances" and a bronze medal in 1874 for a "coffee mill." I suspect there is more to be learned of Mr. Troemner, but combining coins and coffee is a good start!

The LSCC Team also participated in the North Utah Coin Show which was held on January 19-20 at the Best Western Cotton Tree Inn in Sandy, UT.


Ernie Ely hosted the Club table at this event. Ernie's report follows on the next page:




